Last Rites to be Held Tomorrow for George W. Manning

Funeral services over the remains of George W. Manning, a Confederate veteran, will be held at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning at his late home, 1332 Howard street, Rev. Alfred Harding, rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, will officiate, and the interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

"Cap." Manning, as he was familiarly known, was for fourteen years a proofreader at the government printing office. He was a native of Richmond, Va., where he was born sixty-five years ago. He wore the gray in the civil war as a member of the 15th Virginia Infantry, under Gen. Lee, and other noted Confederate leaders, and participated in all the hard-fought battles in which the Army of Northern Virginia participated. He was married in 1868 to Miss Ellen Carter, his war-time sweetheart.
