A Representative from South Carolina; born near Sumter, Sumter District, S. Carolina, May 1, 1789; attended private schools and was graduated from S. Carolina College at Columbia in 1811; served as captain of Volunteers in the War of 1812; engaged in agricultural pursuits; member of the State house of representatives 1820-1822; served in the State senate 1822-1824; Governor of S. Carolina 1824-1826; unsuccessful candidate for election in 1826 to the 20th Congress; elected as a Democrat to the 23rd Congress to fill the vacancy caused by the death of James Blair; reelected to the 24th Congress and served from December 8, 1834 until his death in Philadelphia, Pa., May 1, 1836; interment in Trinity Churchyard, Columbia, Richland County, S. Carolina.
