Burial Tomorrow Morning at Congressional Cemetery

The funeral of the late Mrs. Elizabeth Markward, widow of George W. Markward, will be held tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock from the home of her daughter, Mrs. John W. Thompson, 1410 I street. Rev. W.I. McKenny, pastor of Wesley Chapel, and formerly pastor of Hamline Church, of which the deceased was a member for many years, will officiate. The interment will follow in the family plot at Congressional cemetery.

Mrs. Markward had almost finished the eighty-ninth year of her age and, both in a physical and mental way, was unusually active and alert. She had many lovable qualities and enjoyed the friendship and esteem of a wide circle among the old resident families of the northwest section of this city, in which her life was spent. She spent the past summer with her elder daughter, Mrs. E.C. Reid, at whose home she died suddenly Monday night, following an illness of only a few days. She had made her home of recent years with her younger daughter, Mrs. John W. Thompson, who returned from Europe Tuesday morning to find the sad news of her mother's death awaiting her in New York.
