### **T.E. Marquis, Former D.C. Policeman**

Theodore E. Marquis, a former District policeman and private detective for the Sheraton Park Hotel, died Sunday of cancer in Washington Adventist Hospital. He lived on Sheridan Street in Riverdale.

Mr. Marquis was a native of Elmira, N.Y. After World War I Army service in France he was a Marine Corps recruiting sergeant in Boston until joining the Metropolitan Police Department in 1924. He retired in 1958 and worked for the Sheraton Park Hotel for several years.

A horticulturist, Mr. Marquis developed a new wisteria in the 1950s. He was a member of the Hyattsville Horticultural Society, Bladensburg Seventh-Day Adventist Church and Lebanon Masonic Lodge.
