Retired Chief of Land Division Had Lived Here 50 Years.

Funeral Tomorrow

Dr. William A. Marschalk, retired chief of the Land Division of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Interior Department, died yesterday at his home, 3604 Thirty-fourth street, after a long illness. He was 71.

A native of Fayette, Miss., Dr. Marschalk had been living in Washington for 50 years. He entered the Indian Bureau in 1894 and while employed there, graduated from the College of Dentistry at the old Columbian College, now George Washington University. He retired from the bureau in 1934.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Louise S. Marschalk; a son, Charles W. Marschalk; six daughters, Mrs. Dorothy Smith, Mrs. Ann Mitchell, Mrs. Marion Senge, Mrs. Helen Haymaker, Mrs. Phyllis Stone and Mrs. Ruth Clarke, and a brother, Dr. L. van B. Marschalk, all of Washington.
