Illness Is Fatal To J.B. Mattingly

Retired Maryland Business Man Dies At Home Here -- Funeral Tomorrow

J. Benjamin Mattingly, 81, retired Maryland business man and for the last 20 years a resident of this city, died last night at his home, 1763 Columbia road. He had been ill six months.

A native of Charles County, Md., Mr. Mattingly formerly was engaged in the lumber and flour milling business in Southern Maryland and lived at Laurel, Md. He came here to reside when he retired. He had been active in Democratic politics in Maryland.
