M.G. McCormick Dies; Was Former Banker

Michael G. McCormick, 87, former president of the Security Savings Bank and last charter member of Washington Lodge of Elks, died Wednesday in Garfield Hospital.

Born in Ireland, Mr. McCormick came to this country as a youth, working for a time in Manchester, Mass. He had been a resident of Washington since he was 18 and in recent years made his home at 1929 Biltmore street N.W.

In this city he engaged in various enterprises, being at different times in the tailoring and real estate businesses. He became president of the Security Savings Bank 35 years ago, retiring after 15 years' service.

Until shortly before his death he was treasurer of the Washington Lodge of Elks. The lodge will conduct a special funeral service at 8 p.m. Sunday at the Lee funeral home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E.

Mr. McCormick is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary McCormick.

He will be buried in Congressional Cemetery after requiem mass in St. Paul's Catholic Church at 9 a.m. Monday.
