The funeral of John McElroy took place from his late residence, 803 C street northeast, Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock. The sermon was preached by Rev. Dr. Thomas C. Easton of the Eastern Presbyterian Church, who spoke feelingly of the life, character and virtue of the departed. After the service by Dr. Easton had been finished, the parlors were then given over to Washington Commandery, No. 1, Knights Templar, and the beautiful burial service of that order was read by the prelate, Rev. J. Russell Verbrycke, and Eminent Commander W.H. Yerkes, which concluded the services at the residence.

At the Congressional cemetery, where the interment took place, Lebanon Lodge of Masons held services, which were conducted by D.W. Beach, jr., master.

After this service had been concluded Senior Vice Commander C.S. Wilder and Chaplain McCullough of Kit Carson Post, No. 2, read the service for the Grand Army of the Republic.
