Meader, 68 years old, a retired grocer of Southeast Washington, long prominent in the Masonic fraternity and other organizations of this city, died at his home, 2632 Myrtle avenue northeast, yesterday after a long illness. He was a native of this city and, except for a few years he spent in the United States Navy, had been a lifelong resident here.

Starting in the grocery business here 45 years ago, Mr. Meader built up his business until it was one of the largest of its kind south of New York prior to his retirement 15 years ago.

Mr. Meader was a member of Washington Centennial Lodge, No. 14, F.A.A.M., the Washington Naval Chapter, No. 6, Royal Arch Masons Columbia Commandery, No. 2, Knights Templar, and of Almas Temple of the Mystic Shrine.
