The Funeral of the late Charles H.W. Meehan, late law librarian of Congress, took place this morning at 10 o'clock from his residence on H street and was attended by a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends. The body was enclosed in a handsome rosewood casket, with silver mountings, and the funeral service were conducted by Rev. Dr. Camp, an Episcopal clergyman, of Saratoga, N.Y., who baptized the deceased. The procession then proceeded to the Congressional cemetery, where the remains were deposited temporarily in the vault of D.W. Middleton, Esq. The pall bearers were W.D. Davidge, Commodore Almy, T.M. Smith, Major McDonald, A.R. Spofford, T.M. Hanson, and John Ingle.
