Lt. Calvin B. Meyers, 29, son of Mrs. Bessie E. Meyers of 927 Eleventh street N.E. and the late Frederick W. Meyers, was killed in action in France on July 26. His wife, Mrs. Virginia Meyers lives with his parents.

A native of Washington, Lt. Meyers was a graduate of McKinley High School and George Washington University. Prior to entering the armed forces in October, 1942, he was manager of the Leroy Thayer Dance Studios. He had been overseas since January 1944.

Funeral services for 2d Lt. Calvin B. Meyers, 32, who was killed at St. Lo, France, on July 26, 1944, will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at the Lee Funeral Home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E. with burial in Congressional Cemetery.

A native of Washington, Lt. Meyers was the son of the late Frederick W. Meyers and Mrs. Bessie Meyers, who is his only survivor. He lived at 927 Eleventh street N.E.

After graduation from McKinley High School, Lt. Meyers became a dancing instructor at the studio of his uncle, Leroy Thayer, at 1644 Connecticut avenue N.W. He was manager of the studio for 10 years before he entered the Army shortly after Pearl Harbor.

Lt. Meyers was serving with an armored unit when he was killed.
