Robert McPherson Milans, 64, proprietor of Milans & Sons, printing firm at 707 Eighth street N.W., died yesterday at his home, 3164 Eighteenth street N.W., after a long illness.

Mr. Milans was a native of Washington, the son of Joseph D. and Lillie McPherson Milans. Educated in local schools, he began working for the Southern Railroad. His father, who founded the printing firm, became ill in 1903 and he took over the business.
