## **Sudden And Melancholy Death**

We learn that Mr. John C. Mulloy, of Pennsylvania, a clerk in the Indian Bureau, was at eleven o'clock Tuesday morning, taken with an apoplectic or epileptic attack, and, notwithstanding the presence and utmost endeavors of several eminent medical gentlemen, he died within a few hours. His wife was promptly summoned and was by his side when he expired.

Mr. Mulloy was in the 38th year of his age, and greatly respected for his general intelligence and high qualifications for his official trust, to which he had been but recently promoted.
