Thomas J. Nash Dies

Funeral of Well Known Business Man Will Be Held Today

Thomas J. Nash, sixty-five years old, president of the firm of T.J. Nash & Co., and a resident of Washington for more than fifty years, succumbed to illness at his home, 11 N street northwest, yesterday.

Funeral services will be conducted at his late residence by Rev. J.J. Muir, chaplain of the United States Senate, this afternoon. Interment will be in the Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Nash was born in Culpeper, Va., and came to Washington when a small boy and went to work in the ice and coal business, which he followed up to the time of his recent illness, having established the firm which bears his name.

He was a member of Hope Lodge, No. 20, of Masons and the Coal Merchants' Association, and was well known in the city. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Betty C. Nash, and two children, Miss Ada S. Nash and Thomas J. Nash, jr.
