Rites to Be Held Today For Mrs. Mary Nevitt, Wife of Ex-Coroner

Funeral services for Mrs. Mary Hine Nevitt, 80, wife of Dr. J. Ramsay Nevitt, former District coroner, were to be held this afternoon at the Lee funeral home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E., with private burial in Congressional Cemetery.

Mrs. Nevitt died Sunday at George Washington Hospital. Three weeks ago she suffered a broken hip when she slipped on the steps of her home at 3639 Van Ness street N.W. She had been in ill health since October.

Mrs. Nevitt was the daughter of the late Lemon Hine, District Commissioner from 1889 until he resigned in 1890. He died in 1914. Her mother was the late Mrs. Mary Tillinghast Hine.

Mrs. Nevitt was a lifelong resident of Washington and a member of the class of 1896 at Central High School. She was married in 1894.

Dr. Nevitt was District Coroner from 1900 to 1931 when he retired. They lived for many years at 1820 Calvert street N.W. They had a summer home at Colonial Beach.

Mrs. Nevitt was a member of the Cultus Club and an active member of the Washington Heights Presbyterian Church. She taught Sunday school there for about 25 years and was secretary of the Missionary Society for about 15 years.

Besides Dr. Nevitt, she is survived by a daughter, Miss Ramsay Nevitt, a teacher at Woodrow Wilson High School, with whom she and Dr. Nevitt lived; a son, Leman H. Nevitt, 4324 Brandywine street N.W., in the Bridge Department of the District Government; two sisters, Mrs. Fred Fenning of the Kennedy-Warren Apartments, Mrs. Bessie Boone, Sweet Briar, Va., and three grand-daughters.
