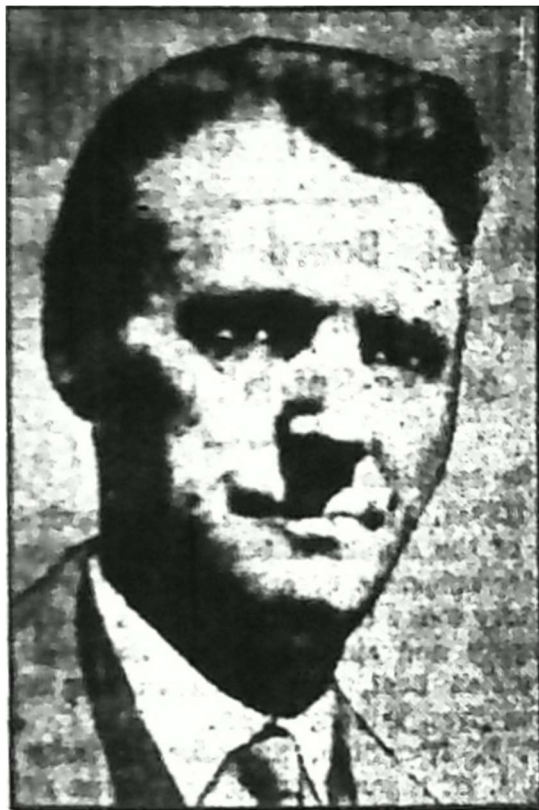

W.H. Nichols, Jr., Dies At Home Here Owner of Chain of Restaurants

Was Picturesque Figure of Capital

William Hamilton Nichols, jr., 64 years old, operator of a chain of restaurants known as "The Ranch" and a picturesque figure in the National Capital, died at his home, 1204 E street, yesterday after a short illness.

A native of Galveston, Tex., Mr. Nichols was the son of the late capt. William H. Nichols of Galveston. He came to this city in 1900.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary F. Nichols; two sons, Lee Hutchins Nichols and William H. Nichols, 3d; a sister, Mrs. E. Nichols, and a brother, Allen P. Nichols, all of this city.

Funeral services will be held in the W.W. Chambers funeral home, 1400 Chapin street, tomorrow afternoon, at 3 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
