Mrs. Nicholson Dead

Mrs. Elizabeth Nicholson, widow of Walter Lamb Nicholson, for many years toographer of the Post Office Department, died at her home in the Belgrade apartments yesterday in her ninety-first year. She had been in feeble health for a number of years, but death was hastened by a fall resulting from vertigo, March 10.
