Charles R. Nixon Dies; Owned Trade Bureau

Funeral services will be held at 3:30 p.m. tomorrow for Charles R. Nixon, 74, former Senate employee who for the last 31 years conducted a trade information bureau here. He died in Providence Hospital Saturday after an illness of several months.

The service will be in the Lee Funeral Home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Born in Washington, Mr. Nixon was the son of Richard B. and Anna R. Nixon. His father was for 50 years disbursing officer for the Senate.

Mr. Nixon became a Senate page at 13 and worked for the next 30 years in the office of the secretary of the Senate. He then established his information bureau, which kept industries up to date on legislation affecting them. Mr. Nixon also was a free-lance newspaper writer.

He was a member of the old Columbia Athletic Club and the National Press Club.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Isabelle Stockett Nixon, whom he married in 1918 and four sisters, Mrs. Kate Nixon Marx, 3123 Rittenhouse street N.W., Mrs. Walter A. Brown, 2713 Connecticut avenue N.W.; Miss Elinore R. Nixon, 1857 Lamont street N.W., and Mrs. Ernest H. Djureen, 2219 North Albemarle street, Arlington.
