#### **August Noack, Sr., Funeral Is Set Prominent D.C. Business Man Will Be Buried Here Tomorrow at 2**

Funeral services for August William Noack, sr., who died at his home, 1503 Spring place, Wednesday night, will be conducted at the residence tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. Dr. H. Dennington Hayes, pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church, will officiate. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Long prominent in business circles, Mr. Noack was formerly president of the old Shoemaker Co. here and for the past 13 years was connected with the R.P. Andrews Paper Co. He was born in Richmond, Va., September 2, 1863, and came to this city with his family during the Civil War. He was educated in the public schools here.

Mr. Noack was a founder and charter member of St. Mark's Lutheran Church and was its treasurer for more than 40 years, serving in the latter capacity at the time of his death. He also was for many years an active member of the Men's Bible Class of that church.

Mr. Noack's death came after a brief illness. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ida Elizabeth Noack; three daughters, Mrs. Frank Howard, Mrs. Lloyd W. Patch and Miss Fannie Noack, all of this city; two sons, August W. Noack, jr., of Washington, and Charles F. Noack of Winter Park, Fla., and two brothers, William F. Noack of Hyattsville, Md., and Howard Noack of Wheaton, Md.
