C.A. Norris Dies; Rites Tomorrow

Brief Illness Fatal to Veteran of Western Union and Native of District

Charles Alexander Norris, who retired recently in the fiftieth year of his service with the Western Union Telegraph Co., died yesterday afternoon at his home, 1719 Hobart street. He had been ill a week.

Born in Washington 65 years ago, the son of the late Anne Rebecca Evans and Charles Alexander Norris, he was a lifelong resident of this city, and was widely known here. He began his service with Western Union when 15 years old.

He had been long identified with the Masons being a member of Pentalpha Lodge No. 23 F.A.A.M. and Mount Horeb Chapter No. 7, Royal Arch Masons.

Norris is survived by his wife, Lillian Craigen Norris; a son, John Gilbert Norris; a daughter, Mrs. Lawrence Buell O'Connor, and three sisters, Mrs. Susan Thomas of Washington, Mrs. Mary Moore of Franklin, Pa.; and Mrs. John Marshall Dozier of Lee Hall, Va.
