Mrs. Mary North Dies At Age of 80

Widow of Rev. J.B. North Was Active in Club Work and as Writer and Editor

Mrs. Mary M. North, widow of Rev. Joseph B. North, pastor of the Garden Memorial Presbyterian church, author, former member of the editorial staff of the National Tribune and magazine contributor, died Saturday at Emergency Hospital from complications resulting from a broken leg received in a fall the day before Thanksgiving. She was 80 years old.

For many years Mrs. North was prominent in the activities of the Woman's Relief Corps of the Grand Army of the Republic, in which she held a number of offices, and in the General Federation of Women's Clubs, of which she at one time was secretary. She also was a charter member of Electra Chapter Order of the Eastern Star, and a member of the Society of Natives.

She was well known here for her journalistic work with the National Tribune, organ of the G.A.R. and as one of the organizers of the Woman's National Press Association. Among her better knwn books is "Prairie Schooner."

Surviving Mrs. North are a son, Dr. J. Beverly North, Washington dentist, and a daughter, Mrs. Paul C. Filly of Herndon, Va. It was at Mrs. Filly's home that Mrs. North fell and broke her leg. Her husband died four years ago.

Funeral services were to be held this afternoon at the Washington Heights Presbyterian Church, with Dr. John C. Palmer, pastor, officiating. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
