Charles B. Parkman Dies

Civil War Veteran Had Been Treasury Employe for 53 Years

Charles Breck Parkman, for the past fifty-three years an employe of the Treasury Department and a veteran of the civil war, died at his home, 672 Maryland avenue, last night. Mr. Parkman had been in failing health for more than a year. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.

Mr. Parkman has been a senior clerk for the past twenty years in the office of the auditor for the State Department. He served as private secretary to four successive first controllers of the Treasury.

He enlisted in August 1862, in the 20th Connecticut Volunteers and served through the civil war. He was confined for a short time in Libby prison, following the battle of Chancellorsville.

He was educated in private schools and at Yale University. He was a member of Burnside Post, G.A.R.

Mr. Parkman is survived by his wife and four children Miss Mary R. Parkman and Charles H. Parkman of Washington, Rev. Henry C. Parkman of Baltimore and S.S. Parkman of New York.
