### **R.L. Pedlow, Former United Fruit Co. Official**

Raymond L. Pedlow, 59, former fruit company official here, died Thursday in West Palm Beach, Fla., of a heart ailment.

Born in Ashland, Pa., Mr. Pedlow was brought to Washington as a child. He was graduated from old Business High School and then went to work for the United Fruit Co., remaining with them for some five years and rising to be manager of the Washington office. He left Washington in the mid-1920s.

At the time of his death he was with the West Indian Fruit and steamship Co. in West Palm Beach.

He was a veteran of World War I service with a machine-gun battalion in France.
