Two Motorists Hurt In Crash With Car Woman Receives Serious Injuries in Collision At Seventh and C Streets Northeast

Two persons were injured, one seriously, shortly after midnight last night, when a streetcar crashed into their automobile at Seventh and C streets northeast, carrying the car along the tracks more than 125 feet.

Mrs. Lydia Pigott, 49, 1231 B street southeast, suffered possible internal injuries, bruises, shock and laceration to the head and neck. Her condition is said to be serious.

John Wood Oliver, 43, of 22 Eighteenth street, driver of the automobile, received numerous cuts and bruises. His condition is not serious.

According to police, Oliver was driving south on Seventh street when the Washington Railway & Electric Co. streetcar, bound east on C street, struck his car, carrying it more than 125 feet along the tracks. The car skidded the entire distance without turning over, but was almost entirely demolished.
