Fred A. Plant Dies

Was Former Resident Here--Succumbs at Chicago

Fred A. Plant formerly of this city, but for the last twenty years a resident of St. Louis, Mo., died Tuesday at the Michael Reese Hospital Chicago, Ill., following a short illness from pneumonia. He was forty-five years old.

As a young man Mr. Plant was employed here, later going to St. Louis. He eventually became traveling salesman of dental supplies for a smelting and refining company of Chicago. He was employed in this capacity at the time of his death. He was well known in Washington, where he had important business connections.

He is survived by two children, Lurtin and Doris Plant, both of St. Louis; by the following brothers and sisters in this city, Mrs. M.A. Reichenbach, Mrs. Josephine Stewart, Mrs. John Sands, Mrs. Alice Patterson, Mrs. Hannah Remkle, Mrs. Charles Chamberlin, Miss Louise Plant and Joseph T.K Plant and by a brother, Charles Plant of Baltimore.

Mr. Plant's body has been brought to Washington. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the home of his brother, Joseph Plant, at 59 Irving street northeast. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
