Sickness, Death And Distinction

A man named William Plowman, a bricklayer, about 45 years of age, was picked up on the street yesterday in a sick and destitute condition and taken to police headquarters, where he had a succession of epileptic fits. He was attended by Drs. Elliot and Page. He is a native of this city, and it is reported that his wife died on Saturday last and this trouble coupled with almost total destitution from long sickness caused his prostration, which it is feared will prove fatal. Plowman died at police headquarters at 11 o'clock today.
