Mrs. Jessie Luce Potter Dies At Home of Son

Widow of James Potter Was Member of D.A.R. and Order of Eastern Star

Mrs. Jessie Luce Potter, 73 years old, widow of James Potter, died at the home of her son, Dr. J. Albert Potter, 300 Second street southeast, yesterday after a short illness.

Mrs. Potter had resided in this city since the death of her husband about 13 years ago. She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Order of the Eastern Star. She resided in Northern New York before the death of her husband.

She is survived by her son, Dr. Potter, and a sister, Mrs. Jennie A. Leubkert of this city, and three great grandchildren. A brother, the late Lieut. Col. Charles R. Luce, who served in the Medical Corps during the World War, died some time ago.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence of her son tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Temporary interment will be in a vault in Congressional Cemetery, pending burial later at Clayville, N.Y.
