Dr. Malvern H. Price Dies in Capital Home

Dr. Malvern Hills Price, 57 years old and a practicing physician in this city for the last 21 years died at his home, 1314 East Capitol street yesterday. Death was due to heart disease. Dr Price had been ill since Monday night.

Dr. Price was born at Cloverdale, King George County, Va. He was the son of the late Dr. William B.K Price and Mrs. Mary Frances Emerson Price.

Coming to this city as a young man, Dr. Price was in the drug business at Thirteenth and H streets northeast for several years. In 1899 he entered the medical school of the Columbian College, now George Washington University. He was graduated in 1903 and admitted to practice medicine in the District of Columbia in the same year.

Dr. Price was a member of the National Medical Association and the Southern Medical Association, in which organizations he took an active interest.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Edna Reed Price; a niece, Miss Jessie Cornwell, and a sister, Mrs. R.P. Queensberry, both of this city; two other sisters, Miss Hattie Price, engaged in missionary work in Rockingham County, Va., and Mrs. James McKenney of King George County, Va.; also three brothers, C.L. Price of Florence, Ala.; E.P. Price of Tyler, Tex., and John Price, living in the West.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock. Rev. Enoch Thompson, rector of the Church of the Nativity, will officiate. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
