Norman Pruitt Rite Set For Tomorrow

Services to Be Conducted at Home With Burial in Congressional Cemetery

Funeral services for Norman Pruitt, who died Thursday afternoon at his residence 105 Sixth street northeast, will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at the home with interment in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Pruitt, who was 76, was born in King George County, Va. His first wife, the late Margaret Rozelia Murray, died November 28, 1882.
