Dropped Dead in the Street

About half past five o'clock last evening, Officer Yeatman picked up the body of an old woman at the corner of 7th and D streets, where she had fallen down dead. With the aid of Sergeant Vernon he removed the body to the central guardhouse, where it was recognized at that of Eliza Anna Pulley, who lived with her niece, Miss Jesse Wells, at the corner of C and 13 1/2 street northwest. She had been ill of late and subject to fits and severe attacks of chills. Coroner Patterson was sent for, and, after viewing the remains and ascertaining the facts, decided that apoplexy was the cause of death, and that an inquest was unnecessary.
