Dr. Marian Pyles Dead

Woman Was Teacher in D.C. And New York Schools

Dr. Marian Pyles died Sunday at her home, 650 Lexington place northeast. She came to Washington with her parents, the late Thomas and Elizabeth Pyles from Reds Corner, Md., when she was three years of age. She was identified with the public schools as soon as she was old enough and passed through all the grades and the normal course. She taught in Washington for several years.

For a time she was in the internal revenue bureau of the Treasury Department. After that she took up stenography. Her health not being good for a time, she went to Massachusetts, where she taught for a few terms.

She was called to be assistant to the principal of the Brooklyn High School for Girls, where her stenography and medical knowledge were called into play. For a number of years she lectured on physiology in the school. While connected with that school she took a course in Columbia University, obtaining a degree.

She spent many of her vacations in Europe the last trip being just before the war, when she revisited the cathedral towns. Interment was in Congressional cemetery.
