Coroner Views Body

Summons Witnesses in Death of Small Boy

A coroner's jury this afternoon viewed the body of Harvey Cushing Richards, thirteen years old, who was struck by an automobile at Virginia avenue and 2d street southeast Saturday afternoon and killed almost instantly. Witnesses were summoned to appear at the morgue later in the afternoon. The deceased was a son of Mrs. Anna E. and the late Noble Richards. Funeral services will be held at St. Peters Church at 9:30 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Killing An Accident, Coroner's Jury Reports

Verdict in H.C. Richards' Case, Minor Traffic Mishaps

A coroner's jury yesterday afternoon heard testimony at the morgue in the case of Harvey Cushing Richards, thirteen years old, 45 D street southeast, who was killed by the automobile of Commander J.D. Robnette, stationed at the navy yard, near Virginia avenue and 2d street southeast, Saturday afternoon. Testimony was given that the boy ran directly in front of the automobile and that its occupant was unable to prevent the accident. Verdict of unavoidable accident was reported.
