Julius Schultz Dies From Heart Disease

Once Served With the Marine Band, Coming to America in the Early Seventies

Julius Schultz, seventy years old, a violinist, who, it is stated, served in the United States Marine Band many years ago and who was a member of orchestras at several Washington theaters from time to time was found dead at his home, 1540 New Jersey avenue northwest, late yesterday afternoon. His death was due to an attack of heart disease. The body was taken to the morgue.

Friends who had known the musician for more than thirty years this morning said they were under the impression that he was a bachelor. He came to this country in the early seventies, it is stated, and had resided in this city most of the time.

The violinist resided in a one-story house. He was the only occupant of the structure, his nearest neighbor being a colored man, who lived alone also. Neighbors were unable to tell the police much about Schultz, but they learned from others that he was a member of the musicians' union, and that he had played at entertainments given by the more prominent German societies.
