Funeral of Mr. Smith

The funeral of Mr. John Smith, an old and much esteemed citizen of the Sixth Ward, who died on Sunday last, took place yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock from his late residence, at the corner of 11th street east and M street south, and was attended by a large number of relatives and friends. Columbia Encampment, and Eastern Lodge I.O.O.F., Liberty Lodge, No. 6, Knights of Pythias, and the Friendship Beneficial Society, of which he was a member, formed the escort, with the Marine Band and Heald's Band. The body was encased in a handsome mahogany coffin covered with black cloth and heavily mounted with silver. The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Halliday, of the M.E. Church, and the remains conveyed to the Congressional Cemetery followed by a great number of relatives and friends.
