Mrs. Mary Smithers Dies

Washington Woman Expires at Son's Home in Virginia

Word has been received of the death of Mrs. Mary L. Smithers, widow of Edward L. Smithers and resident of this city for forty years, who died Thursday at the home of her son, George F. Hullings, Fort Myer, Va.

Mrs. Smithers was born in King George county, Va., seventy-two years ago and spent the early part of her life in her native state. She was twice married, her first husband being William H. Hullings, who was a soldier in the Confederate army. For the past forty years Mrs. Smithers had lived in Washington and during that time was a member of the Fifth Baptist Church, taking an active part in its matters. She was especially interesting in the Darlington-Berea Sunday School Class, which was organized by the late Judge J.J. Darlington.

Funeral services were conducted by Dr. J.J. Muir of the Temple Baptist Church at her late residence, 151 North Carolina avenue southeast, which was followed by interment in Congressional cemetery. Surviving her are four children, with whom she made her home, George F. Hullings, Otis Hullings, Mrs. J.W. Taylor and Mrs. Charles C. DeCetley.
