Funerals

On Monday afternoon the funeral of the late Wesley A. Stockett took place from his late residence on K street south, near the Navy Yard, and was very largely attended it being one of the largest funerals which has taken place in that section of the city. Rev. George V. Leach, of the East Washington Church, conducted the services at the house, at the conclusion of which the remains were taken to Congressional Cemetery where they were interred. Harmony Lodge, headed by Heald's Band, Tuscarora Tribe of Red Men, and Capitol Circle Brotherhood of the Union, (H.F.,) C.A., of which associations the deceased was a member, attended in large numbers. The associations were preceded by the Marine Band.
