Richard P. Whiteley, 78; Retired FTC Executive

Richard Peyton Whiteley, 78, an executive with the Federal Trade Commission for many years, died yesterday in Doctors Hospital after an operation.

A native Washingtonian and a lifetime Democrat, he served as a member of the Maryland House of Delegates in 1912. He retired from the FTC in 1953.

After receiving his AB degree from Maryland Agricultural College in 1898, Mr. Whiteley served as sergeant in the Spanish-American war. Later, he graduated from George Washington University and the Georgetown University Law School and became an attorney in the Justice Department.

In 1924 he joined the FTC, rose from assistant chief counsel to chief trial counsel and retired as Director of the Bureau of Antideceptive Practices.

Although he formally retired in 1951, Mr. Whiteley did not actually leave the FTC until 1953. After that he devoted his time to golf, among other things. Last June he won first prize for his age group in a national tournament of the Senior Golf Association held at the Westchester Country Club.

Surviving are a son, Robert F.S. of the home address, 2915 Woodland drive nw., and a daughter, Mrs. Robert W. Parker of 5313 Falmouth rd., Westmoreland Hills, Md. His wife, the former Mary Norsworthy Shepard, died last March.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Friday at Gawler's Funeral Chapel, 1756 Pennsylvania ave. nw. Interment will be private.
