Due To Accident

Coroner's Jury Investigates Death of Jane E. Young

A coroner's jury at the morgue today investigated the death of Jane E. Young, eighty-five years of age, who died at her home, 753 8th street southwest, last evening, the result, it was alleged, of injuries received by falling from a street railway car at 7th street and Pennsylvania avenue the night of February 25 last. Several witnesses were examined.

Dr. James Herbert, 634 Pennsylvania avenue southeast, testified that he was called to attend Mrs. Young the night of the accident. He found her hip bone fractured and she was suffering severely from shock. About two weeks before she died pneumonia developed.

William Green, conductor of the car from which Mrs. Young fell, stated that he was on the front platform of the trailer and saw two ladies get on. He pulled the bell and the car started. Some one called that an old lady had fallen, and he stopped the car and ran to her assistance as a colored man pulled her up.

The jury, consisting of T.B. Walker, C.W. Porter, L.J. Smith, W.A. Pyles, Jerome Biggs and J.W. Bartley, rendered a verdict that the death of Mrs. Young was due to accident. No one was held responsible.
